Our Policing Pledge

As part of Leicestershire Constabulary's commitment to delivering the Policing Pledge, we will:

- Provide you with details of your local neighbourhood policing teams.
- Ensure neighbourhood policing teams and other police patrols are visible on your patch at the times when they will be most effective.
- Respond within 24 hours to messages left for your neighbourhood policing team.
- Aim to be with you promptly (if attendance is required) if you call us about an issue which has been agreed as a neighbourhood priority.
- Hold monthly public meetings or surgeries, giving you an opportunity to meet your local policing team, tell them about issues that concern you and have your say.
- Make more information available about local crime and policing issues, including the provision of crime maps.

Our priorities

Our local Pledge to you is that during the next three months, we will tackle the following local priorities:

1. To reduce the incidents of speeding vehicles on Hedgerow Lane, Kirby Muxloe between 8am and 6pm, seven days a week.

Since the last newsletter we have had a positive response to our campaign to tackle parking problems outside Blaby schools. We will be running a similar campaign in the near future.

During October we held a number of home security crime prevention roadshows in conjunction with Blaby District Council. We followed this up by working with the Fire Service and District Council on making sure Bonfire Night and Halloween would be safe and enjoyable for all. This included posters available from local officers to discourage trick-or-treaters where they were not wanted.

Neighbourhood update

Listed below are the priorities you told us about three months ago and how we tackled them:

You told us...

To identify vulnerable/elderly persons that live in the area of Glenfield Lane, Kirby Muxloe. This will help to reduce the risk of distraction burglaries and other similar crimes by setting up a No Cold Calling Zone in this area of the village.

We responded...

By visiting local residents in the area and asking them to support a "No Cold Calling Zone." With the assistance of Trading Standards a scheme has now been successfully established.

We would like to encourage all the residents to challenge and report those not complying with the zone by contacting the police on 0116 222 2222 or contact Trading Standards on 0845 4040506.

You told us...

To prevent and deter acts of anti-social behaviour on the recreational ground, particularly around the library and back of the bowls club during the school holiday period.

We responded...

By carrying out patrols in the area. There were a number of minor incidents reported to us including the theft of a bicycle. The bicycle was recovered, returned to the owner and the offender dealt with.

We will continue to target a very small minority of young people who on occasions cause anti-social behaviour in the village.
