Local Housing Needs Survey

Dear Parishioner

Many of the houses in this area were built in the 1960s and '70s which resulted in many of you moving into the village at that time, a lot of people have remained in the same houses. Over time, housing needs change, and it may be that you wish to down size, possibly to a bungalow, or that some of your family wish to start their own home, but find that either, there is no suitable house to move to in the area, or that you are unable to afford it.

There are ways of overcoming some of these problems, such as the building of starter homes or bungalows which may either be rented or bought with shared ownership, but before this can be done we need to know if this problem exists and if so how big is it. To do this can I ask you to fill in the attached survey. The questions on page 2 onwards only need to be filled in if you would like to be considered for alternative housing, we would ask all residents to fill in page 1 so we can have a full profile of Ryhall.

The form is sent out by the Parish Council in conjunction with Rutland County Council, but the completed forms are not seen by either Council, only by the Rural Housing Enabler. Please complete and return your forms in the enclosed Freepost envelope. Replies are required by the end of March 2007.
